Costa Rica Teaching Team

An amazing response to the gospel of grace was the highlight of our August workshop in the mountains of Costa Rica. Following our teaching on the book of Romans, several people stood up and told the group that they had never understood salvation by faith in the finished work of Jesus Christ before. Others said they had lived in fear of losing their salvation and were now eternally secure in Christ forever. The size of our group grew almost daily and by the end of the week we had a total of 23 new attendees. Most of these people heard the good news for the first time.

Another aspect of this trip which made it so special was the fact that we were joined by three DM2 teachers from Bolivia. These men, who primarily come from very impoverished areas of Bolivia, either paid their own airfare or were supported by others in their churches. How encouraging it was to fellowship with them and to sit under their teaching. DM2 has been carrying out a ministry with these men in their home country for several years. Now they are taking the initiative on their own to conduct workshops in other countries like Costa Rica and Mexico. This is the principle of 2 Timothy 2:2 in action. It was also a major help to have Larry Depue join us. Larry, who is a missionary in Bolivia and long-time friend of DM2, provided teaching and insight regarding our future ministry in Costa Rica. – **Rob Armstrong**
