Our trip to Liberia in November was fruitful. We had 52 people attend the 5 day Romans 1-8 workshop where we taught the first 8 chapters of the book of Romans verse by verse. The response was so numerous we actually had to turn people away. We could have easily had 100 people in attendance if we had had more workbooks.

The testimonies of those attending were incredible. One day during our last hour wrapup a woman was so moved by what God was teaching her she broke out in an Africa song of praise. When she finished the first line, the entire group burst out in song together with her. It was such a spontaneous and beautiful moment of praise that both Bret and I welled up with tears of joy.

Based on the questionnaires, it appears that roughly 20 of the 52 people who attended put their faith in Christ alone for salvation. These included churchgoers, Sunday school teachers, evangelists, and amazingly even a few of pastors. Many of them previously felt they needed to do something, by way of good works, to earn their way to heaven. After studying Romans 1-8, they realized for the first time in their lives that salvation is a free gift by God's grace given to those who respond by faith to the person and work of Jesus Christ. It was a beautiful thing to see these folks freed from the burden of sin and rest with confidence in the finished work of Jesus Christ.

Please keep the nation of Liberia in your prayers. Some of those we taught have already begun to teach workshops on their own. Several are planning to teach Romans 1-8 until we go back to Liberia in February 2016.

Similar to how the believers in the church of Philippi shared in Paul's ministry through their giving, many of you have shared in our ministry in Liberia by sacrificial giving. And just as the Macedonians shared in Paul's triumphs, you too will share in any successes among the Liberians (Phil. 4:15-17). Without a doubt, in eternity there will be individuals looking you up to thank you for the impact you had on their eternal destiny. To God be the glory forevermore.



Update on DM2 Campus Ministry at Eastern Washington University

One of the young women Rachel discipled is teaching a DM2 Romans 1-8 class on Friday nights and it is going really well with young folks coming from various church backgrounds. Please continue to pray for this amazing expansion. Also more young adults are coming on Monday nights this semester. Over 10 new people came the first Monday, with several returning this last Monday. This is good news.

Our God is a wonderful, faithful, powerful God. His work in us cannot be missed when it has all the marks of His holy character and abundant power. Late last year I realized that DM2 workshops had spun completely out of control here in Colorado, and I no longer knew who was teaching what, where they were teaching, or when – and that I could not possibly find out. This amazing situation has come about simply because 2000 years ago the Lord commanded us to make disciples as we go about our daily lives, and we took Him at His Word. Again we are very grateful to DM2 and the original vision that came to us four years ago. At that time we didn't know what to expect!

In brief, here are a few of the examples that we know about, and what is happening:

Eric, who has attended every workshop here, is teaching Romans 1-8 to an international audience through Skype. Miranda and Rene' have started teaching Women of the Word to a local group of ladies. It is a great group.

With my help, four of our attendees from the Making Disciple Makers workshop have come together to organize and teach the Romans appendix to a mixed group of college and high school students in Lakewood, CO. This is being organized with a church that was unknown to us until only recently. We are hoping for this to be an inroad to pave the way to teach the full Romans 1-8 curriculum. Interestingly, three of the four organizers are under the age of 22.

Chuck has been teaching Making Disciple Makers to a group of five at the Denver Rescue Mission. This Sunday we will begin teaching Philippians in the DM2 format.

Lorelei is hoping to start a Women of the Word study with her college campus group at the University of Northern Colorado.

Collin is teaching the Gospel section of the Romans appendix to his high school group.

Bernie and Chuck are going to help me demo DM2 in Cuba, with a group of 350 pastors. With the Lord's help we hope to receive the invitation to return and begin disciple-making there. Also Turner and I are planning to take a trip to Riobamba, Ecuador in late May or early June. Our hope is to start a group of disciple-makers there also.

I am so grateful for DM2 and Miranda, one of our church members. It was because of her faithful persistence that we started this process and it has been a great tool for fulfilling our responsibilities in the Great Commission of our Lord.

The church here continues on. The DM2 notes have been foundational to our teaching and training. As I teach using the notes, not only am I being trained; I am teaching others as well and beginning to see fruit from these labors. Two of the men I am teaching are now using the DM2 notes to teach with some frequency and ease. In fact, our church is installing a Power Point system with a touchscreen monitor in the pulpit so these man can more easily teach the notes.

Through this process, I am learning to rely first and foremost on the Scriptures by observing the direct text and then referencing other supporting passages. This has forced me to become more acquainted with the Scripture, allowing and freeing me to leave behind erroneous traditions of men that had been passed on to me.

The DM2 style of teaching has shown me how I can teach a book of the Bible on my own, without DM2's notes. By copying the DM2 outline style, I have been teaching through the book of Daniel. To me this means the process is in fact very repeatable and therefore multigenerational. As I pass on the mindset with which DM2 has entrusted me, this process will continue long after I am gone. God be praised!
